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

The forthcoming motor racing season will feature a new championship series that should provide widespread competitor and spectator appeal. It is the Ford Sport Championship, for standard productions Ford Laser Sport and Escort Sport models. The Series will comprise seven rounds, commencing at Pukekohe on December 6, thereafter the major January international meetings, concluding at Timaru on February 7. The overall prize fund of \$6000 over these seven races provides competitors with a substantial championship stake.

This new series represents an extension of the popular Escrot Sport circuit series that has provided very close and exciting racing since 1978. Whilst Escort Sports that previously competed are still eligible, major attention will be on the new Laser 1.5 Sport hatchbacks, already proven class winners in the opening races in the Benson and Hedges Saloon Car Series.

Specifications for both models in the Ford Sport Series are completely standard production, with no modifications being permitted. Very close racing is likely to result and the Ford Sport Series seems likely to provide competitors and spectators alike with keen challenge and interest in the forthcoming season.

BAYPARK SCANZ CHAMPS ROUND 2

Brilliant Mt Maunganui sunshine saw some very spirited driving from the competitors in round two of the 2 Litre Sports Racing Car Championships held at Bay Park on the 21st of November.

With many competitors turning up the day promised to be a successful one, but a combination of constant radius curves, ever present sand and perhaps over enthusiastic driving saw a heavy toll of machinery.

Many otherwise mild mannered cars became evil handling brutes on Bay Park and I believe it was this factor which saw Ross Monk send Rhubarb III into the tyres after the hairpin - hard enough to demolish the tub and suspension, yet surprisingly leave the fibreglass shell almost unmarked!! Ross immediately began negotiations to purchase another tub and has already began rebuilding this very quick car.



Concern was expressed at the recent fifth meeting of the FISA Pacific Regional Committee that Formula Pacific cars may be developing advanced and expensive devices to gain maximum advantage of airflow ground effect.

Would all competitors please note that the current provisions of the Formula Pacific International Specifications Para.ll.6 will be rigidly enforced.

The regulation is stated as follows:

'Skirts': The only parts of the car permitted to be in contact with the ground whilst the car is standing or in motion, are the tyres.

Under no circumstances can any part of the bodywork, or of the suspended part of the car be below a plane passing 1 cm under the bottom of the drivers seat and at least 4 cm above the ground, the car being in normal racing trim with the driver aboard.

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Letter From Abroad

Its now a year since I left Wellington, so I thought I would write an open letter to keep all you folks up to date with my exploits.

I travelled back to England last December via 5 days in Tahiti, 3 days in Los Angeles (Disneyland) and 7 days in Chicago, to find that my tenants hadn't left my house. After a certain amount of pressure they left 7 days later. My house was 40 miles NNE of London near Stansted airport.

I returned to work at the BP office at Harlow. After 3 months was transferred to BP's Head Office in the City of London, a door to door journey of 75 minutes. I had already decided to move further south and at the end of July I moved to within 2 miles of BP's Harlow offices (!), now only 45 minutes, Car/train/walk from work.

Meanwhile I put out the word to all my dealer friends for a Datsun 1200. I was a Mini man but I was converted in New Zealand. Amazingly because there aren't many about, a 1200 came in as an exchange deal on 4th February. It was promptly rebuilt with an Aley cage and knobblie tyres (Uniband remoulds at \$25 each including tax!!) and has done rallies as an organiser and rallies as a competitor since (8000 miles). I have been doing road rallies (where navigation skills are vaguely necessary in the left hand seat) rather than stage rallies and I have won the 1300 class every time except one when a (POM) exhaust system fractured and once when I was second. Best result was 8th o/a out of 65 - and this with a standard engine and carb.

Early in April I bought a 1200 Coupe as a road car. Each 1200 has cost me $\pounds 475$ 0 \$1050 at the current rate of exchange.

I often have BP people from New Zealand phone up when they're on visits to the United Kingdom and have heard about all the latest moves and happenings. Sir Michael Fowler and the Town Hall, etc. The betting at BPNZ was that I would be back within a year - Well that isn't quite the case, but the thought has crossed my mind several times......

My current home phone number is Nazeing (STD code 099289) 2436, and my work number is a London number 01-920 8728 - no extension as we all have our own external lines (3000 of them!!).

I am currently working on an IBM system, using VDU's - but these are no ordinary green/black screens - these are 3279's - colour screens seven colours - which we use for a management information system which is available to directors and senior staff of the company - high boys indeed. It can also display graphics - bar charts, pie charts, graphs - all in technicolour.

We are having a very cold winter - we've had more snow - before Christmas - than we would normally have in three years. -22C was recorded one day up in Scotland, and its been as low as -10C around here. The weather forecaster said that he had to get some more temperature labels to put on his map as the ones he had didn't go low enough.





For speed events how about these for classes:

0-1100 1101-1300 1301-1600 1601-1800 1801-2300 2301-0ver

These class limits appear to be used quite a lot in British club racing, club rallying, and hillclimbs.

Why I see them as being good sense here in New Zealand is:

0-1100

Previously 0-1300 was very competitive, to win this class meant having a car right on the 1300 limit. This being required for maximum horsepower to stay ahead of the competition (that old saying "no substitute for cubic inches). By instituting the 0-1100 class small engine cars, e.g. Mini 850's, 105E Anglias, Mini 998 and 1098 Starlets and other small Jap imports would make for close racing. It would also give beginners a chance to modify an existing car, without first having to swap to a larger engine option.

As a well know engine reconditioner was heard to say "1100 escort motors, we throw them in the tip!!

1101-1300

The cars for this class would be the fastest out of the previous 0-1300 class requiring \underline{NO} changes in cc's to remain at the top of their class.

1301-1600

No changes here (good now onto a more interesting class).

1601-1800

In the old scheme of things, any one with a BDA Ford would clean this 1601-2000 class VP. As any self respecting BDA was 2000c, this meant that any one with a 1600 Escort or Escort Sport, MCB, and any number of mid range family type cars was left right out in the cold when it came to picking up a class win. My apologies to Lloyd Evans and Glen McIntyre seems not all BDA's are 2 litre.

2.

1801-2300

Here is the class for the big guns. The limits are set to cater for cars with a performance capability in excess of 180hp. Hopefully this will include BDA Escorts, H.D. 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
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The New Way from

To the 16 competitors plus the family and friends that came with them, thank you for coming and making the day the success it obviously was. To those that didn't come, you missed a great day out - don't miss next years!

The results have been made out by awarding points to competitors on the basis of 1 for 1st in test, 2 for 2nd in test etc. For those that didn't attend and are wondering what the tests were, a brief description follows:

- 1. WIGGLE WATER: A wiggle woggle test where the driver had to pick up a cup of water, carry it to the far end of the test and the passenger had to carry it back. Penalties were incurred for spillage.
- 2. SACK-A-CLOVER: Competitors had to put their legs into a sack, jump to their car and then drive in loops around 3 markers set in a clover formation. (After getting out of the sack)
- WATER WAITER: Again a wiggle woggle test with this time a jug of water balanced on the bonnet. Penalties for spillage.
- 4. RING-A-ROUND: Competitors had to make two circuits of a pole with the passenger holding a rope clear of the ground during the circuits. (The rope was attached to the pole).






The technical committee is concerned about the broad interpretations placed by competitors on coachwork regulations (page 289 of 1981 yearbook) in respect of wheelarch flares.



In summary an enjoyable day with a great turn out of competitors and spectators. I'm sure a few more of these type of events will be appreciated by a strong contingent in Wellington.

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

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



It's funny how familiarity breeds contempt, well known local but unnamed landmarks such as the Northland Tunnel specifically mentioned in the CRIs (outside the brackets) led several crews astray. One of the most frustrating things I found when I began trialling in Wellington was this use of unnamed local landmarks, it is reminiscent of navigating by where the Shamrock used to be 2 years ago etc. Which brings me to another misleading article of note etc. can not be used in signs unless specified in the ASRs and an 'ASCOT THEATRE etc.' sign is one I haven't seen yet.

Some others were trialling in their own home area, even to their front gate one might say (the check was beside their letterbox) managed to stay on the road they were on, I suspect for not quite the right reasons, they also missed two very local straight ahead traps. Odd how cars turn corners all by themselves......

One well known VUCC triallist noted for his 'odd' flashes of logic, drove through several traffic lights. His car must have been very bent, some would say like Rafferty's mind. Others turned left at a 'TRAFFIC LIGHT' sign ... never seen one of those. Some even turned right at a Tee, at the Tinakori Road exit off the motorway, which is actually a conventional crossroads. TUESDAY 4 MAY 7.15 P.M. AT THE CLUBROOMS

This trial will be known as the LEYCARS AUTODROME MAY NIGHT TRIAL.

There will be several prizes of car care products to be awarded to various places throughout the field.

A.S.R.'s in brief:

Targa timing will apply. This will be explained on the night to those who are not sure about it.

One minute time allowance will apply after all manned CHECKS and CONTROLS and for all "U" turns.

Words in capital letters enclosed in quotation marks refer to signs. e.g. "ST JOHN ST".

All roads with kerbing and/or channelling across their entrance, except for the club driveway, are deemed not to exist.

The order of priority for negotiating intersections is:

- 1. Wellington Car Club arrows.
- 2. These A.S.R.'s (Additional Supplementary Regulations).
- 3. Manned CHECK or CONTROL handouts.
- 4. The C.R.I.'s (Competitor's Running Instructions).
- 5. The straight ahead rule (Appendix T Rule 24/2(i)).
- 6. Commonsense.

Instructions in brackets are for clarification only.

Ends of Sections or Sub-sections will be identified by the name of the street and the direction of approach.

If you arrive at the dead end of a no exit street, do a 'U' turn and write "NUT" in the next blank space in the TIME/CODE column on the driver's card.

Requirements: Competitors, each crew having a vehicle, clipboard, pen, torch, sense of humour and a map of Wellington including the Eastern Suburbs.

Any problems you may have on the trial may be discussed with the organisers at the conclusion of the event.

The trial will be approximately 90 minutes long.

Remember that these trials are prepared by people who have a similar interest to you in motorsport. My interest in night trials of this sort is to enjoy an evenings drive with a small amount of thinking. To sort out a winner and other placings, "traps" are put into the trial which will hopefully cause you to think through descriptions, priorities, alternate meanings and sometimes English language useage. Reading the trialling information and rules in the MANZ Yearbook is a good start and then getting out and competing in trials is the only way to improve by practise.

In particular we seek your input in the areas of encouraging North and South Island participation in the Championship, championship structure, specifications and regulations, etc. Whilst we cannot guarantee that they will be directly applied, we can assure you that your suggestions will be considered in full along with our own plans and those of the Formula Ford Association.

NEWS FROM THE WORLD OF FORD

The Ford Cl00 Sports Car in 1982

In the forthcoming season, Ford Cl00 sports cars will contest the world endurance championships for both makes and constructors and the International German Racing Championship.

For the World Endurance Championship of Makes, two Ford Cl00's will be entered and prepared by Ford of Germany in co-operation with Zakspeed. The Drivers will be Swiss Formula 1 star Marc Surer, West German Champion Klaus Ludwig, Formula 1 racer Manfred Winkelhock and Capri Turbo driver Klaus Niedzwiedz. For the World Endurance Series for drivers there will be a single-car private entry from the British-based team of Alain de Cadenet - and for the German Championship there is to be a single-car entry from Zakspeed to be driven by current champion Klaus Ludwig, with Jagermeister sponsorship. All the cars, which are powered by the Ford DFL 3.9 litre endurance racing engine, are being manufactured in Ford's Motorsport Workshops in Cologne.

Development during the winter, under the direction of competition engineer Eberhard Braun, has been directed towards improving the aerodynamics of the original shape in addition to ensuring that the Ford Cl00 complies fully with the revised regulations for Group C.

The Escort RS1600I

A new high performance 115 PS fuel-injected Escort with a close ratio 5-speed transmission is being announced at this year's Geneva Show.

Called the Escort RS 1600I, the new car has a maximum speed of 188 km/h and performance through the gears from 0 to 100 km/h of 9.0 seconds. It will be available through selected Ford dealers in Europe, initially in West Germany only, and production is scheduled to begin in the Ford Plant at Saarlouis, West Germany at the end of May.

The new Escort will be offered in a three-door body style only. It will have modified front and rear suspension systems, unique Ford RS front and rear spoilers, a unique interior trim scheme, extra wide alloy sports road wheels, a close ratio 5-speed transmission and a Bosch fuel-injected Ford CVM engine. It will be offered in the full range of Escort body colours and most of the regular production options will be available.

Changes to the Ford CVII engine include the fitment of Bosch K-Jetronic fuel injection, a special gas-flowed cylinder head, a high-lift sports camshaft, high performance inlet and exhaust systems, and an A.F.T. electronic ignition system in which the distributor is replaced by twin coils and the spark plugs are triggered directly from the flywheel.

The close ratio, 5-speed transmission drives to the front wheels. The 15" diameter 6" width rim alloy sports wheels are fitted with 190/50 x 15 HR tyres.

Both the front and rear suspension systems of the new rally sport Escort are designed for competitions use with uprated spring and shock absorber units, compression struts at the front, and increased diameter front and rear stabiliser bars.

Sports style front bucket seats in two different styles will be offered for the new Escort together with a further choice of two different sports steering wheels - one of which is leather—covered. In addition to its special wide alloy road wheels, the model also has Ford RS front and rear spoilers and body side decals.

Ari Vatanen joins Ford Works Escort Team for 1982

World Rally Champion, Ari Vatanen, is to rejoin the Ford Works Rally Team for 1982. Although his primary task will be to assist in the testing and development of the new Ford Escort RS 1700 Turbo Rally car which is scheduled to make its competition debut later this year, he will also contest the 1982 British Rally Championship.

For the British Championship, Ari and co-driver Peter Bryant, will drive an Escort MkfI rally car which is being prepared and serviced by M.C.D. Services of Liverpool. The British program is being supported by Shell Motorsport in whose colours the car will compete on the Mintex, Circuit of Ireland, Welsh, Scottish and Manz rallies.

In addition to Ari Vatanen, British Rally star Malcolm Wilson and co-driver Phil Short, are also joining the newly formed Ford works rally team. They too will be closely involved in the new Escort Turbo rally car test and development program but will also compete in a number of British and European rallies in a privately entered Escort MkII prepared by Malcolm himself.

"I am delighted that Ari has rejoined us" said Peter Ashcroft, Competitions Manager, Ford of Europe. "During the comparatively short time that he has been one of the world's top rally drivers, he has acquired a wealth of experience which, combined with his undoubted natural driving talent, will make him an invaluable member of our new team".

NEWTOWN PETROL GARAGE - APRIL NIGHT TRIAL ORGANISERS COMMENTS

Some minor alterations were made to the provisional results but this did not alter any final placings.

One crew did not get ASR's and one crew misunderstood the DER dead end road ASR, and two or three crews missed a manned check in Bidwell Street and there was allowance made for this.

Of the 13 starters, 4 crews did not miss any checks and although a couple of crews got off course for a short time all crews finished well inside the maximum time allowance, in fact only 2 were more than 15 minutes overall late.

We attempted to set a trial with several traps, as stated in an earlier magazine, but it was not our intention to get people hopelessly lost, and yet still set an interesting course for the experts, and give the newer trialists some experience of what not to fall for next time.

In section one the only trap was, go left after passing "CHECK ODO", the previous CRI had included, pass "CHECK ODO" therefore for two separate CRI's two "CHECK ODO" signs would have been required, however by proceeding ahead "CHECK JURS" was found and then end of section control. For those who went wrong there were some additional CRI's to get to control. (Remember when you arrive at a Control any CRI's not completed must then be ignored.) This caught out 6 of the 13 crews.

In section two there was a CRI to keep left until "CIVE WAY" (not GIVE WAY), by keeping left you arrived at a manned check with a handout deleting the instruction and sending cars back on the same route as those who did not pick up the trap, this time 7 out of 13 were wrong.

Shortly after this there was what we thought an obvious straight ahead into Ceardegan Way, however, 6 crews decided not to use it, an arrow on the way out of this dead end road kept all cars on the same course.

In section three whilst keeping left there was an unmanned check board ("U") at the end of a dead end road for those who turned at the end of the road. Again 6 crews either did not go up this road at all, or did not go to the end of it. Some said the board was hard to see, however, more crews saw it than missed it.

Four crews did not pick up the CRI with only one L in Daniell Street, and another six crews thought that "CHECK CHECK" was "CHECK", remember the CRI's said anything in capitals inside quotations was the same as a sign being looked for. Nobody got lost because of these traps, because in car trialling language, 'mugs routes' had been planned.

For those who made mistakes, please come back again, and try not to fall for the same traps again.

We enjoyed organising and running the event, our thanks to all people who manned checks and helped out in any way, and thanks to the competitors, most of whom seemed to enjoy the event. Spread the word, Car Trialling can be fun.

Lastly, but not least, congratulations to John and Marie Thomson for winning the tow rope and torch donated by Newtown Petrol Garage for the winners.

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buchanan engineering datsun 1200

IAN JENSEN AND CHRIS CLARKE'S BUCHANAN ENGINEERING SPONSORED DATSUN 1200

The Datsun was built from a standard road car in about 6 weeks. This entailed the help of many people and a lot of hours.

Malcolm Buchanan was to be the co-driver for the rally season after he had successfully navigated Chris in the clubs economy run.

The first rally was the VUCC/MG Bermuda Pools Rally. A major problem because apparently after about 2km into the first stage it was found that the navigator was not compatible with the car, which meant that his internals were rather emptied in a great way. This earned Chris the hard luck prize for the first stage. When this stage was rerun as the fourth stage a navigator was borrowed from a car that had a blown diff. Slight contact between the fan and radiator over a rough section meant that the car was withdrawn from the rally.

The first of the Central Region Rally series was the Western Building Society Rally run by Wanganui Car Club in the Lismore Forest. During the first half of the stage Chris was having problems coming to grips with the slippery conditions. On a steep downhill section the right rear corner came in contact with the bank where he then proceeded to do a wall of death act along the bank then back onto the road. Shortly after this while going over a rough section, a piece on the side of the oilpump broke off. The sudden loss of oil pressure meant a great flash of orange warning lights before the driverand co-driver's eyes. The 30lb oil pressure switch certainly saved the motor, but unfortunately not before most of the oil was emptied from the sump. It was not until one of the trailing competitors broke down nearby that we were able to borrow some oil from him, plug the hole with a piece of wood and drive out of the stage.

After another pump was fitted we joined the rally at the tail of the field, and completed the rally. Some problems were experienced getting to the start of the final stage. A 45 minute hold up on the start of the stage which was at the top of a steep hill meant the clutch had a very hard time with a tail first gear getting to the start line.

It appeared that we were lucky to complete the stage as a number of acute turns then uphill during the stage gave the already tired clutch a hard time. Being at the tail of the field meant that we caught and passed a number of cars, the highlight of which was catching and passing a Datsun 1600 in the middle of a ford. It was the widest part of the road in that section of the stage, and after being held up a number of times by cars in places that you could not pass the opportunity was taken. Hopefully enough steps have been taken to overcome the problems that we encountered during the rally and that perhaps lady luck will be on our side for the car's third rally.



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



Central Region Rally

WANGANUI 198

Wanganui turned on an overcast warm day for the First Round of the Central Region Rally Series. Rain earlier in the week had ensured that the dust problems of last year would not occur on this occasion.

Mark Jennings/Jim (Ice-cream) Robb in the BDA were top seeds, but their motor didn't arrive back from Auckland in time, so they were forced to withdraw. Other Wellington entrants to withdraw were Dick and Silvanna Prouse (BDA motor still in bits) and John Gladhill/Peter Hughes (new cross-member unable to be completed in time).

The Rally this year comprised only four stages, three in Lismore Forest, and the other, a short 8 km flatout shingle/seal job with a couple of tricky corners in the middle.

Stage 1 was 37 km long and only 10 km into the stage Murray Rawson (Escort BDA) became the first retirement of the Rally, when the flywheel holding bolts let go. Glen McIntyre punctured early in the stage, and decided to stop and change it, loosing some three minutes. A spin then lost them a further minute or so putting him back to 19th place for the stage. The tight twisty parts of the stage, and the occasional wet patches seemed to suit some of the smaller cars and the placings for the stage were: Jones (Datsun Sunny), M. Stewart (BDA), B. Green (BDA), J. Clunie (Datsun 1200), B. Herbet (Lancer), E. Bruce (Escort 1600), R. Stephens (Corolla 1600), C. Wright (VW 2Litre), G. Blacklaws (Datsun Violet) and T. Mason (BDA).

Gordon Blacklaws' (along with Wellington co-driver Lloyd Rance) Rally came to an end shortly after with suspected piston failure, whilst Doug Townsend's Escort seized it's diff only 3 km into the 24km second stage. Struan Robertson lost time when his coil came off, Rick O'Neill was forced to retire the Civic with a large hole in the gearbox casing, when some gear teeth went looking for less confined spaces.

This time it was Malcolm Stewart's turn for FTD, closely followed by Glen McIntyre, Kerry Jones, Brian Green, Errol Bruce, Tom Mason, Bruce Herbet, John Clunie, Cambell Wright and Murray Sollitt (Datsun 1600).

It was then back to the service area for a lunch break. There didn't seem to be much panel damage at this stage, most withdrawals, being due to mechanical problems.

Stage 3 was a quick 5 minute down hill sprint, round a left hander then flat out following the railway line, with a few blind brows to sort the men out from the boys. In previous events, the stage had always been run in the opposite direction, but it was certainly more interesting for spectators run downhill. Kerry Jones was 2 secs ahead of Malcolm Stewart, followed by McIntyre, Green, Herbet, Joe McAndrew (Mazda RX 3), Ken Richards (Datsun 1200), Clunie, Wright and MacDonald (Datsun 1200).

Stage 4 was the longest at 45 km, and with some difficulties being experienced clearing the stage, was some 45 minutes late getting under way. Rumour had it that the Lead Car broke down, and couldn't get radio receiption so had to climb a hill on foot carrying the radio, aerial and car battery to get his message through. The drivers took advantage of the delay to argue about whether the VW would make it to the finish, could Malcolm Stewart pick up 40 seconds to head off Kerry Jones, and how many kilometres will we get before that guy behind catches as, etc. (i.e. all the usual bullshit!!

But when the Stage got under way about 4.30 p.m. it was Jone again who was fastest through, followed by Stewart and McIntyre. Green blew a head jasket, and lost some 4 minutes to the leaders getting out of the stage.

Fourth fastest was Herbert, then same Clunie, Mason, McAndrew, MacDonald, Brown (Datsun 1200) and Dick Cook (BDA). Errol Bruce lost time stuck on a windrow. Whilst Campbell Wright's VW lost oil pressure and grawled out of the stage.



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

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National Rally Championship

NATIONAL RALLY ROUND 1 TOKOROA

Mark Jennings was the only other Wellington Car Club entrant, but he retired after the 3rd or 4th stage, without any damage.

There were very few accidents that we saw, only a few cars had bent front guards so the finishing rate was very high and as the Honda (new sponsers 'AGFA' blank casette tapes and film) got through the night with no problems, we have hopes for the next local Rally.







AUCKLAND CAR CLUB 6 JUNE 1982

We competed in this trial after 3 weeks holiday around the North Island, and rather than fill the magazine with boring detail I will just give a few statistics.

The trial was officially 340 km, we did about 440 km. Official time was about 8 hours, it took us $10\frac{1}{2}$ hours. We got 118 checks, there were 131 checks.

There were about 60 traps, which accounted for about 75 checks, because some traps cost 2 checks, and one trap cost three checks.

We were never early on 9 occasions were only about one minute late at 8 other checks we were between 2 and 18 minutes later, and three times we were maximum late. However, the organisers deleted time at one check because they had forgotten to remove a U turn check from a morning section when we arrived back on the same road later in the day. We claim 25 minutes at one check because of what we considered was an incorrect instruction and this was allowed. We were 31 minutes late in the second mapreading, but perserverence paid off as we only missed one unmanned check. During the late morning and early afternoon we managed a good spell of 51 checks without missing one.

The Trial started and finished in Auckland but generally covered an area within a 40 kilometer radius of Pukekohe. There was a great variety of types of roads and generally was very interesting.

We lost a total of 2869 points, and there were 20 starters. One crew from the South Island, one from Manawatu, three from the Wellington area and the rest from the Auckland area.

Our verdict of the organisation was that we would go back again next year, time and money permitting.

Oh by the way we were very pleased with our 6th placing, even after falling for the trap near the end which cost us 3 checks (540 points).





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

A LETTER TO ALL CLUBMEMBERS

The following is a letter to all club members from the 1981-82 Committee. It deals with information crucial to the future of the Club. Please read and consider the following very closely.

Most of you will be aware that the club was involved a number of years ago in the purchase of some land with the intention of developing a motor sport complex. The venture was unsuccessful for a number of reasons and no good purpose will be served in debating the rights and wrongs or whys and wherefores now. It is history.

What is not history (yet) is the fact that funds were raised by debentures to fund the venture. These debentures, and the interest owing on them, is still outstanding. Briefly therefore, the financial situation is as follows. For the sake of simplicity, the figures have been 'rounded off' and are not accurate to the exact dollar and cent.

Funds in Hand \$2400.00

As can be seen, this leaves a shortfall of \$11600.00. The question that has to be asked is, how are we going to repay the shortfall quickly and allow the Club to continue looking forward with optimism?

The Committee feels that the coming 12 months will require a special effort from <u>all members</u> to assist in fund raising schemes that the incoming committee will be responsible for developing.

We also earnestly recommend that all members consider the benefits of past and future club membership, and involvement in motor sport, and request that you all make some form of donation to the club funds. This is seen to be the easiest and quickest way of 'knocking a hole' in the debt.

By way of a lead, we the committee, between ourselves, have agreed to donate to the Club. We earnestly ask you to consider coming forward and doing the same. If every member was to make a donation of \$50, some \$7500 would be available. This would go a long way to clearing the debt.

Debenture holders may like to consider waiving payment of either the interest on their debentures and/or the interest and the capital amount.

The sum of \$50 has been mentioned above. This is not meant as a suggestion as to the value of donation we are looking for. Many of you may be in a position to offer more, whilst others may be only able to offer \$10. The deeper you all 'dig', the better the financial position of the club will be.

The future of the Club therefore is in your hands. Please come forward and assist in this future.

Welcome to the mid-winter motorsport newsletter. Whilst the racing action is quiet, recent weeks have seen some major moves that promise to really quicken the pace in the forthcoming season.

MANZ ANNUAL GENERAL COUNCIL MEETING - June 11-13.

The Annual Meeting of the Motorsport Association was held in Christchurch over the weekend of June 11-13, and the constructive spirit and involvement evident showed that the sport, both racing and rallying, is in good heart.

A feature of the conference was the Saturday evening dinner and prizegiving, which included notable speeches from David Oxton, Jim Donald, Reg Cook and Owen Steel (retiring Racing Manager of Shell Oil). The opportunity given to the Company and the writer was taken to express our disappointment over the regulatory issues, protests and appeals that have prevented the confirmation of a Motorcraft Formula Ford Champion for 1981/82. On a positive note, the Company's commitment to motor racing in 1982/83, with increased prize money for Motorcraft Formula Ford and the announcement of the new Laser Sport Circuit Series was well received by all.

MOTORCRAFT FORMULA FORD CHAMPIONSHIP - 1982/83

At the MANZ conference, preliminary agreement was reached with MANZ and race promoters over the format of the 1982/83 Championship. Basically the format is as per that discussed at the Bay Park Ford function, and comprises six regional rounds, six major rounds and one final that combine to minimise competitor travel costs but ensure a completely "national" championship.

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


WORKING BEE


To have totally wiped the whole section might have set an undesirable precedent of encouraging exaggerated claiming thus removing some of the appeal and enjoyment of trialling.

Section one was just to check the odo and get from the Clubrooms to where the map reading started near Petone.

It was refreshing to find a ten minute allowance to plot grid references at the beginning of the map reading. Didn't do us much good though, we managed to commit a major blunder by plotting one reference in the wrong square and get it very neatly on the wrong road, this cost us two checks for carelessness. We then had a choice of shortest route and when we did not find a check on our first choice we went back and tried again, still no check but a lot of time wasted. Moste of the map reading was on the Western Hutt hills but eventually ended just north of Stokes Valley. Here we put away the map and started section three telling ourselves it was time to settle down and find out how bent straight line diagrams can be.

We did very well until we ended the section at a 'Check' instead of a 'control', many other experienced triallists also had red faces when the results came out and only 3 crews out of 21 reported to the control.

Section four was a mexuture of tulip diagrams and normal instructions plus the use of a couple of ASR's. Tulip diagrams are difficult for an organiser to get 100 percent accurate but an excellent job was done. Only 5 crews managed to get all the checks in this section and our perserverence after our earlier problems paid off when we got this section correct and managed to finish in fifth place overall.

Our congratulations to Bill Archer and family from the Hutt Valley Motoring Club, who only lost 372 points, and to Murray McGuire and crew who won the Wellington Honeypot Trophy and finished fourth overall.

GOLD STAR TRIAL WALL TROPHY



After about 20-30 minutes of time and upsetting a manned check on more than one occasion who insisted we shouldn't even have been there that early, we discovered the intended route and completed the section with numerous scribblings in the claims area on the card.

The final section was a touring one that took us back to Upper Hutt and final control there to be greeted with a tremedous buffet supper and cups of hot soup.

Our thanks go to Vic Car Club for organising a really enjoyable trial and to the sponsors and others who helped make it so.

lucas midnite trial

This trial was the second round of the Gold Star Series and the third round of the Local Wall trophy Series, and the organisers promised a good event which would not be mind boggling. We are of the opinion that the organisers carried out their promise.

The trial started at Upper Hutt College at 5.30 p.m. (6.02 for us) on 7 August and was to finish about midnight at the same place, we actually finished at 1.05 a.m. on 8 August.

The first section took us around Upper Hutt and into the Mangaroa area. All was well until the odo check we were about 5% short and just a little undecided on the stay on this road rule, however, we did what was required by the organisers. Then we picked up a trap, found a check, and then spent about 15 minutes trying to find a delete instruction for the trap which did not require a delete, however, we found another couple of traps on the way through Te Marua to the bottom of the Rimutaka Hill and only lost 5 minues on time at the end of section control. Section two took us over the Rimutakas investigating all the straight aheads and getting held up by a bus, however we were only two minutes late and got the only check.

Section three required maximum concentration for 1 hour 26 minues, through Featherston, Greytown and to Carterton, mostly to the West of the main road, including several grubby tracks and 27 checks of which about 14 were for traps. We got caught twice, once for backing back to a convenient turn around point at a U-turn check and missing a check on the opposite side of the road, and once for an A.A. sign which we interpreted incorrectly, however, we were only $2\frac{1}{2}$ minutes out (early for a change) at the end of section.

Section four had an all important overriding instruction which, if applied correctly got you 7 checks, out of a total of 10. The fog was starting to be a nuisance and our eyes were beginning to hang out spotting signs and checks and the feet were busy on the pedals trying to keep up a 60 km/h average, especially after missing one intersection in the fog, nevertheless we managed to find all the checks and were only about five minutes late.

Next was a short section to take us to Greytown School Hall for supper and the end of the Wall Trophy part of the event. No checks in this section had us worried till we checked at the finish and found there weren't any - even exactly on time for a change.

Well we managed first local crew at this stage and with Murray McGuire and crew finishing fourth, Wellington Car Club had the first team towards the Wall Trophy again, however, with John and Marie Thomson being the only other crew from Wellington we cannot compete with other clubs who have more crews competing and get more points because of more enthusiasm for at least having a go.

After supper another short section with only 11 checks, but 7 of them for traps, in and around Greytown, took us to the start of the Map Reading. Must have forgotten to add the minutes for U-turns here because we got all the checks but were 5 minutes early.

The Map Reading was nearly two hours and covered a lot of the area east of the main road between Greytown and Featherston. We missed three checks out of 25, which was not too bad for us and reasonable when compared to the performance of other crews, and we only lost 54 points at the four time checks. At one stage we had a long discussion with Murray McGuire regarding the legality of a handout and were a bit lucky to do what the organisers wanted. A shame Murray's claim was not allowed, however, I don't think he stayed at the finish to discuss it personally with the organisers. There was also one check which we missed which I doubt if many got due to a grey interpretation.

The last section was a touring section with a couple of straight aheads which proved no problem, until we could not find a specific instruction to get us into the finish control. BENSON & HEDGES PRESS RELEASE NO.1.

MODIFICATIONS WILL SPEED UP CLASSIC SALOON CAR RACES.

The bigger-engined cars will be considerably faster in this year's three-round Benson & Hedges Series to be held on North Island circuits in October and November.

Speeds will rise due to a just-announced decision by the New Zealand International Grand Prix executive committee to completely alter the format for the open class cars.

The decision has been promulgated following news that a special run of Holden Commodore 'SS' cars is to be assembled by General Motors New Zealand Ltd. at Trentham, Upper Hutt. The Holden's will be fitted with 5000cc V8 engines and 4 speed manual close ratio gearboxes.

Unlike previous years when only exhaust systems and brakes could be modified, entrants are now able to modify cylinder heads, fit bigger inlet and exhaust valves, lighten engine flywheels, machine manifolds and generally improve the power output of motors.

Where optional large capacity fuel tanks are offered by the manufacturer, these may also be fitted under the new regulations.

"We stress however, that the New Zealand assembled car classes up to 2-litre remain strictly for standard production vehicles. Not one nut or bolt can be changed," said Mr. Jack Christie, President of the New Zealand International Grand Prix Association.

Any car of which at least 25 have been assembled by a New Zealand motor manufacturer is eligible, and there is a 22-litre limit on imported fully-built up models.

For the first time since 1967, the Benson & Hedges at Pukekohe on November 14 reverts to six hours duration - up half an hour on the 1981 race distance.

The first two events, at Tauranga's Bay Park on October 24, and Feilding's Manfeild circuit on October 31, are run over the same duration as last year. The Tauranga event is 2½ hours long, and the Feilding race, three hours.

This year's Pukekohe finale is the 20th running of New Zealand's classic long distance saloon race event. The race was initially known as the Wills Six Hour from 1963 to 1967, and became the Benson & Hedges Classic the following year.

For several years the race began at mid-day and ran into hours of darkness, but this year's classic is scheduled to commence at 11 a.m and finish at 5 p.m.

With the benefit of a dry track, the new liberalised engine modifications will result in record speeds for the 1982 Series.


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



The next section somewhere north of Christchurch took us over some very interesting back roads to Waiau.


