#### MSNZ AGCM

Well, yes, it was a bit of a talk fest, but there are new things a foot that will affect you directly.

Possum.......That is the nick name of the new online database that will be replacing the system known as Sybil. The new data base is being built from the ground up and will allow you to access all of your info online. Not only licensing, but you can have your car details attached, get notifications of upcoming events (based on the preferences you select), enter individual events online (where it automatically inserts your details), nominate transponders being used, allow you to transfer car details when you sell to another MSNZ license holder, etc. Organisers will apply for permits online and that will allow competitors to enter at the same time. It will also allow organisers to see the entrants

details, and as a result streamline documentation. Organisers will even know who needs scrutineering based on the log book history entered from each event. This will be a major improvement to the existing system, with the full calendar of all events in one place, and a one stop shop for all of your motorsport activity. Watch for it to be progressively rolled out later this year.

Governance Review......The sport has been undertaking a review of the governance structure, where the major problem is the blurring of governance and management issues at the Executive level. Therefore it was agreed that MSNZ will move to more of a corporate type structure with a Board (partly elected and partly appointed) to undertake governance, while the existing Commissions will have a management focus to deal with the nuts and bolts of running the sport, alongside the people employed in the office that undertake the administration. Hopefully there will be a clearer definition of roles and responsibilities, allow for better and more responsive decision



making. This is a work in progress with final recommendations to be made and a change to the MSNZ constitution to be formally adopted.

Training and Volunteers...... A formal working group has been set up to recognise the roles volunteers play in all aspects of our sport, and to provide them with tools and support, especially where they have more official roles. They too will be able to utilise the new Possum system to volunteer for events and be kept informed. Hopefully it will provide stronger links, where many volunteers don't belong to any car club, but have a huge involvement in our sport. Proper training systems and modules are also being developed to improve skills and develop consistency.
